## **SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

We had a total number of fifty one (51) center days in 2014. During each of these center days, we ministered to children with an approach called; 'individual child attention'. This enabled us to reach out to individual children, to attend to their needs, build a strong healthy relationship with them and to ensure that they are growing in the Lord.

Our discipleship strategy for children has been in clusters. Children who come from the same village met once in two months in one of the homes. CDE staff and volunteers ministered to these families effectively.

Monthly prayer meetings for parents were very successful. During these meetings, we also had special sessions about positive parenting and building a Christian family.

Devotions and Bible studies were very successful. Children are reading their own Bibles and they participated actively during Bible classes.

Christmas Celebrations went on successfully. It was the most enjoyable time of the year for the CDE.

## **PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

During each center day, we were able to feed children on a balanced diet. We prepared 102 meals for children in 2014. These include breakfast and lunch. This has helped to improve the health of children and has served as a motivating factor for them to attend center days effectively.

We issued out six beds (6) in 2014. This makes the total number of beds issued to children since December 2010; fifty (50). These beds are gifts to individual children from their sponsors. All these children never had a bed or mattress; they were either sleeping on rugs which are placed on the ground. The sleeping conditions of our children and their siblings have improved because of these beds.

Two (2) children received mosquito nets from their sponsors. They also received Jerry-cans for fetching water.

Children have continued to practice good health practices at home, school and at the center. We have continued to distribute bars of soap to each child monthly and this has helped to improve their personal hygiene and that of their families.

The Medical and Food Funds have been a great blessing to our children. These children come from very poor families who cannot afford appropriate medical care for them. Each month CDE has helped to pay medical bills and food support for at least four children. This has helped to keep our children healthy and stronger thus helping us to achieve our physical development goal.

### **COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

We registered a general improvement in the performance of our children. We have monitored this through schools visitation, remedial classes and assessing their report cards. This success is attributed mainly to the school fees support which children receive from their sponsors.

Fifty five (55), fifty six (56) and fifty Eight (58) children received school fees top up for first, second and third terms in 2014. Children and parents are very grateful to God and to their sponsors who made this happen. They attended school undisturbed without fear of being sent back home for lack of school fees.

Remedial classes and English lessons went on successfully during each center day. Children are improving on their writing and reading skills.

### **SOCIAL – EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

The Sponsor – child relationship is growing. Children wrote letters to their sponsors.

The introduction of a pen-pal club is going to help the children to grow socially and to be exposed to a broader environment.

Fifty six (56) children received Christmas gifts which they used to buy family meals. It was an enjoyable time for the children, their parents and siblings.

Thirty seven (37) gifts were issued to individual children in 2014. These are special gifts from their sponsors. They are very helpful to children and to their families. They used them to buy clothing, shoes and scholastic materials.

Two (2) goats were given to individual children from their sponsors in 2014. These are being reared by parents. These goats are a form of income generation which will help the children to continue in school after they have graduated from the CDE.
